Church of England, continued

According to the information I received from our local Anglican archives, Rev. Wilson came to serve St. Peters Episcopal Church, Tacoma, Washington, about 1889. During the ten years previous to this, he had almost single-handedly established the Church of England in southern Manitoba.

Among the places he served as one by the name of Pembina Crossing, the district in which I grew up. I am currently working on a history of its Anglican Church, St. Lukes, one of the most historical parishes in the area. Members of my family have been associated with this parish since its establishment in 1885 and prior to that were served by Rev. Wilson.

The following is the data which I have to date:

Rev. Thomas Neil Wilson, born in Scotland c.1841, educated at the University of Glasgow, made a deacon 1872, ordained a priest 1873.

Served High Bluff, Manitoba 1872-1878, Nelsonville, Manitoba, 1878-1889.

In 1883 he married a Miss Grace Whitaker, born c.1856; I do not know whether they had any children prior to their departure from Manitoba.

Ideally, I should like to locate a descendant of Rev. Wilson, and would therefore very much appreciate any clue that might assist me in this search.
